Fr. Marion's Corner

The Spiritual Life

For many people, going to confessions is still difficult. Why is this the case? One possible reason: in examining their conscience, they are only looking for failures, faults, and sins they have committed since their last confession; the graver, the better. Although it is important to know our sins and ask for God's forgiveness, but if this is the ONLY focus, then I can easily see how people can get tired of the guilt and bad feelings associated with this thinking and decide not to go to confessions altogether. May I propose a solution?

To reflect and confess past sins is only the first part of a good examination of conscience. There are two other levels of examination that we ought to consider: Response to inspirations and virtues and Development of relationship with God.

2nd examination: Response to inspiration of the Holy Spirit and to virtuous acts. We are not only called to walk away from sin and evil, but more importantly, we are called to embrace what is good, true and just. In fact, sins of omission is more grave than sins of commission because the call to love is at the heart of what defines us as children of God. So, a possible question to ask ourselves might be:

How did I respond when I was called to be: discipline, pure, gentle, compassionate, joyful, generous, forgiving, grateful, prayerful, service, humble?

If we neglect any of these virtues, how can we still claim to be a child of God? We must be led by the Holy Spirit to imitate Jesus.

3rd examination: Development of our relationship with God. To know, love, and serve our God is at the heart of everything. What is the point of walking away from sins and living a virtuous life without a relationship with God? It will only lead to vanity. "Everyone, look at me and notice how good and virtuous I am!" We think, say and act a certain way because we are in love with God! And we cannot love God if we do not take time to be with Him. So, some possible questions might be:

Have I deliberately taken time to spend with Jesus?

In what way have I contributed to my relationship with God?

Why do I keep putting off signing up for a Holy Hour with Him?

When was the last time I listened to God? What did He say to

When was the last time that I stopped to recall how much my God loves me?

Confessions should not only be a confession of our sins, but also a confession of our desire to live a good and holy life and especially a confession of our desire to love and be loved by our God.
