

Phase 2 COVID-19 Protocols

- Self-assess PRIOR to entering the Campus. In the last 14 days, have you:
 - *Traveled internationally?*
 - *Been exposed to a person with suspected or confirmed COVID-19 without the correct PPE?*
 - *Had a temperature at least 100.0°F?*
 - *Had new or increased shortness of breath or difficulty breathing?*
 - *Had a new cough?*
 - *Had at least two of the following symptoms together (Chills, Muscle pain, Headache, Sore throat, New loss of taste or smell)*
- Masks are required immediately upon entering the Campus. Ensure your mask covers your nose and mouth area.
- Sanitize your hands.
- Look for volunteers at the CHECK-IN table to ensure your name is on the list of registered personnel
- Maintain a distance of 6 ft from all non-family members at all times. Family members may sit together, however, families must maintain a 6 ft separation from all others attending.
- Access to restrooms are limited to no more than 2 people at a time. Individuals waiting to use the restroom must maintain at least 6 feet of distance between each person. Use of soap and water to wash hands is required prior to leaving the restroom.
- Make every effort to STAY SAFE by limiting interaction with others attending the Mass or religious event. Physical contact should be avoided.
- No hospitality events are authorized i.e. no food or drinks will be served before or after any Mass or event. All-day events such as Sparks of Fire require brown bag lunches and dinners.
- When attending Mass observe all protocols listed above in addition to new procedures for receiving holy communion (Sanitize hands, present NON-dominant hand on top and flatten hand, after receiving communion depart the church and proceed to your car maintaining social distancing, avoid lingering to talk to friends).

In the event of a positive COVID-19 test result the following action will be taken:

- Information will be gathered related to the date, time on site and people with whom the person had interactions.
- The Skagit County health department will be notified to determine next steps with both persons who had contact with the individual and recommendations on cleaning.
- The Archdiocese will be notified to discuss Health Department requirements and next steps for communication, building cleaning, etc.
